 Bay Ferries offers service from several ports. From Shelburne, Maine to Yarmouth, it's a 45-minute drive to Digby, the drive is about two hours. From Prince Edward Island to New Glasgow, expect a four-hour drive to or call 877-762-7245.

Arrive by Air
 Fly into Halifax Stanfield International Airport (flyhalifax.com), which offers daily flights from across Canada, the USA, and Europe. Shelburne is approximately a 2.5-hour drive from the airport.

Arrive by Land
 From Halifax, take Highway 103 west via the South Shore for a direct route, or follow the scenic Route 3 along the coast. You can also take Highway 101 west through the Annapolis Valley, connecting to Highway 103 toward the South Shore.

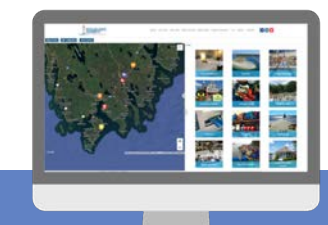

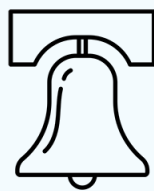


DID YOU KNOW?

1. One of Canada's Oldest Towns:

Shelburne is home to one of the most intact 18th-century communities in Canada. The town was originally founded in 1783 as a settlement for Loyalists following the American Revolution.



2. Black Loyalist Heritage

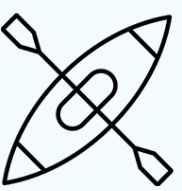


8. A Sailor's Dream

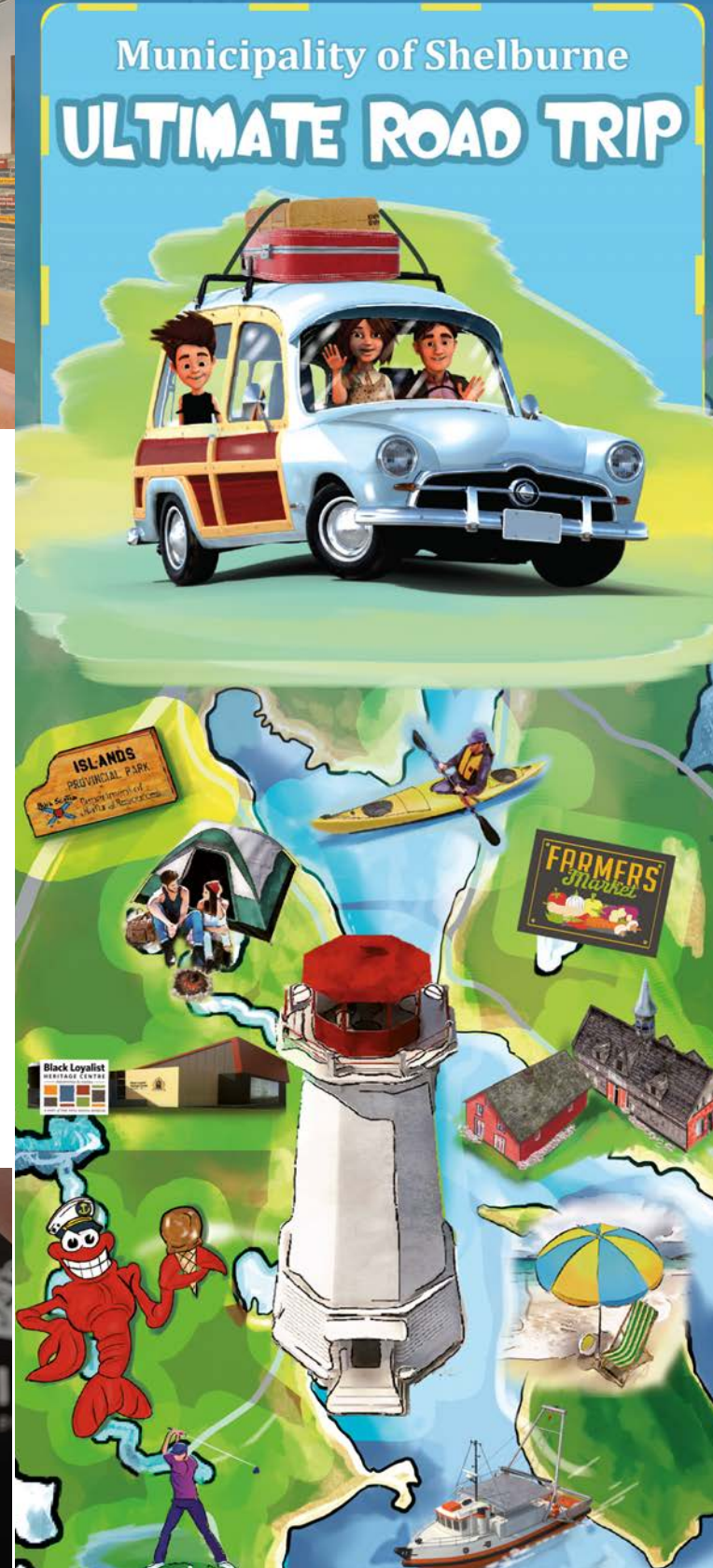
